

Who Am I?

This gentleman was a Cadet at the Military Academy in West Point from 1839-1843 when he graduated and promoted in the Army to Bvt. Second Lieutenant. He was a classmate of U. S. Grant.

As part of the 8th Infantry Regiment, he was assigned Garrison duty at Fort Marion, Florida and then on to Fort Brooke, Florida where he faced brief skirmishes with the Seminole Indians who had aligned themselves with escaped slaves. Surviving several bouts of Yellow Fever he was transferred with the Militia Occupation of Texas in 1845-46.





As part of the 4th Infantry, this man was heavily involved in the War with Mexico 1846-48 being engaged in the Battle of Palo Alto; Battle of Resaca de-la Palma; Battle of Monterey and the Siege of Vera Cruz, Mexico in 1847. He participated in the Battle of Cerro Gordo and the capture of San Antonio; the Battle of Churubusco as well as the Battle of Molino del Rey where for Gallant and Meritorious conduct he was promoted to Bvt. First Lieutenant.

In the Battle of Chapultepec, September 13, 1847 he was promoted to Bvt. Captain for Gallant and Meritorious conduct. He was part of the frontal assault and capture of the City of Mexico.

Now a little about these two new board members.

Karen Neville

Karen Neville resides in Berlin. She grew up in Pocomoke. Neville worked for Worcester County Library for 37 years. She retired as assistant director in 2019. Ms. Neville looks forward to joining the Historical Society Board in 2021. Previously, she served as a board member, vice-president, and president of the Worcester County Historical Society in the early 2000's.

Jefferson Moak

Jefferson M. Moak, a graduate of Randolph-Macon College (B.A. in History, 1974) and Temple University (M.A. in American History, 1998), has enjoyed a 45-year professional career with appointments at the Free Library of Philadelphia, Philadelphia' 76, Inc., the Philadelphia Historical Commission, the City Archives of Philadelphia and the National Archives at Philadelphia. He moved to Worcester County, Maryland in 2017 after retirement. He now works as an archivist and genealogist.

He has undertaken extensive research into the architectural, cartographic and neighborhood histories of Philadelphia, publishing several guides to Philadelphia research including *Philadelphia Street Name Changes (1995, 2000)*, and *Architectural Research in Philadelphia (2001-2002)*. He did the research necessary to put the Chestnut Hill neighborhood on the National Register in 1985. His master's thesis focused on the early land development of Chestnut Hill, Roxborough, Springfield and Whitemarsh townships in the old Philadelphia County.

He has been active in many lineage societies during his career and currently sits on the boards of the Pennsylvania Society of the War of 1812 (as Registrar and Genealogist) and the Delaware Society of the War of 1812 (as Registrar). In addition, he is General Registrar for the General Society of Sons of the Revolution, and Historian General for the General Society of the War of 1812. He recently stepped down from the position of Registrar for the Pennsylvania Society of Sons of the Revolution that he held from 2003-2020. Previously, he served on the boards of the Chestnut Hill Historical Society (now known as the Chestnut Hill Conservancy), the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania, and the Colonial Society of Pennsylvania. He is an accomplished genealogist, compiling several genealogies and currently works as the verifying genealogist for several lineage societies.

In 2017, he presented a paper before the International Society of the History of the Map on 19th century Philadelphia map publishing – a topic which has intrigued him since the 1970s when he compiled a bibliography entitled "Atlases of Pennsylvania" and published "Philadelphia Mapmakers," a small history and directory of those connected with the map publishing industry.

He was elected to the vestry of All Hallows Episcopal Church and the Furnace Town Foundation Board in 2019 and appointed Archivist of the Episcopal Diocese of Easton in May 2020.
